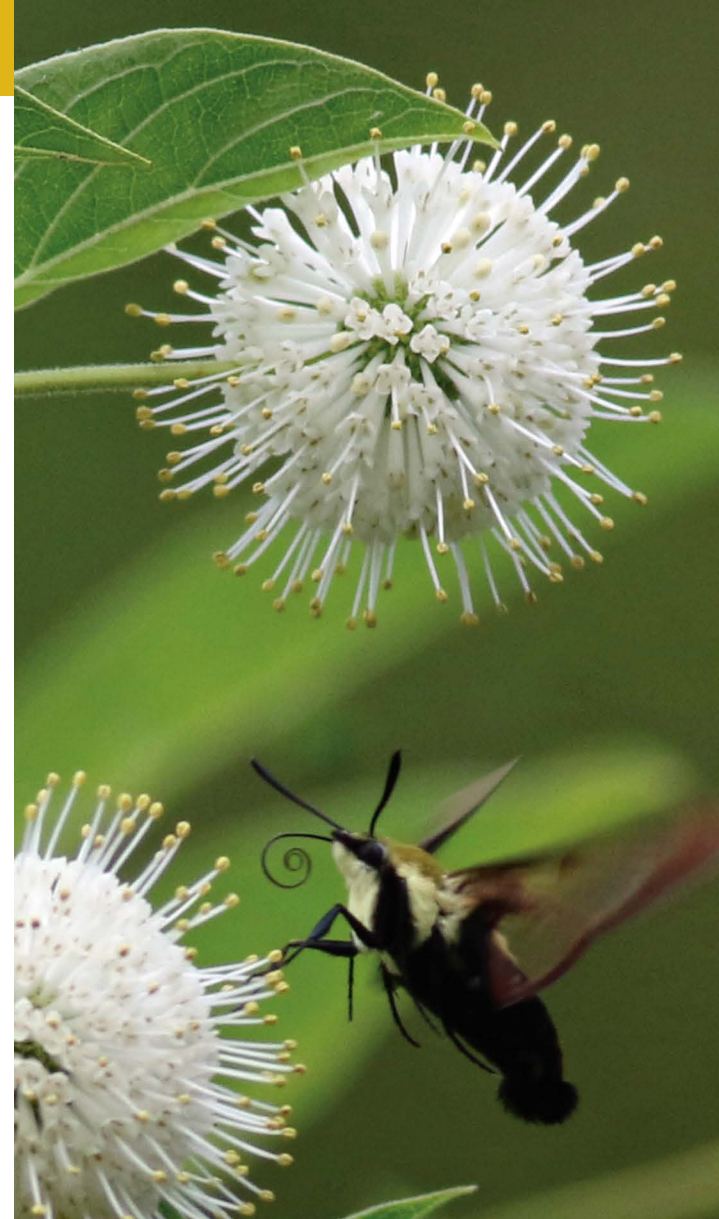

This brochure is for anyone interested in nature-friendly gardening in the Piedmont region of North Carolina. The Piedmont, located in the middle of the state, ranges in elevation from 300 feet in the east where it meets the Coastal Plain to 1,500 feet near the mountains. The region occupies about 45% of the area of the state.

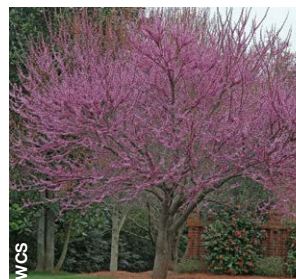
Featured in this guide are 34 plants found in a variety of natural plant communities in the Piedmont. Attractive and versatile, these species also provide habitat and resources for wildlife. To assist with plant selection, a companion booklet includes details on each plant and its optimal growing conditions. The North Carolina Native Plant Society produced these guides to promote the enjoyment and conservation of the state's native plants and their habitats.

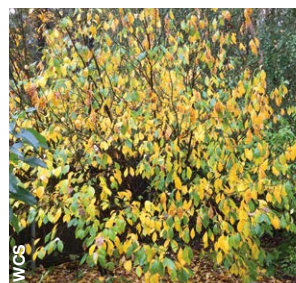
